Why This Matters



A recent study by Latinos LEAD shows Latinos and other marginalized groups are severely underrepresented on nonprofit boards in California. Sonoma County, home to over 3,000 nonprofits and a vibrant Latino community (30% of the county's population), reflects this disparity, with Latinx board members making up less than 10% of nonprofit leadership. Addressing this gap is essential for boards to truly reflect our communities.

Objectives

- Increase representation of Latinx, BIPOC, and LGBTQIA+ leaders in influential board and commission roles across Sonoma County.
- Equip participants with essential governance skills to serve effectively on nonprofit boards and government commissions.
- Expand participants' professional networks through mentorship and exclusive access to established community leaders

Program Structure

Join Our 12-Week Program!

- **5 in-person** Saturday sessions (8:30am - 3pm).
- **2 evening** networking mixers on weeknights (5pm - 8pm).
- Small **cohort sizes (16-24)** for meaningful connections.
- **Minimum Attendance Requirement:** Fellows must attend at least 6 of the 7 engagements, which include the Saturday sessions and networking mixers.

Tuition & Scholarships

Tuition for the BRIDGE Program ranges from **\$800 to \$3,250**, depending on your organization type and membership status. A sliding scale ensures affordability for government agencies, nonprofits, businesses of all sizes, and individuals enrolling independently. Discounts are available for group registrations, and more detailed information is available on our website.

The BRIDGE Program is designed for individuals who:

- Are new or newer to board service and want to build a strong foundation in governance.
- Aspire to join a nonprofit board or government commission within a year and make an immediate impact.
- Are passionate about shaping equitable policies and practices in nonprofits or local government.
