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BRIDGE Tuition Information

The BRIDGE Program costs \$4,400 per student. This sliding fee schedule makes it accessible to organizations of varying sizes and sectors, including government agencies, nonprofits, businesses, and individuals.

By aligning tuition with organizational capacity, we ensure BRIDGE remains inclusive, sustainable, and empowers diverse leaders to step into decision-making roles across Sonoma County and beyond.

- Applications Close: January 21, 2026
- Acceptance Notifications: By or before February 20, 2026

Additional guidelines

- **Discount for Group Registration**: Organizations registering multiple fellows (2 or more) receive a 25% discount on each additional student after the first.
- **Payment Terms**: Payment is due upon acceptance into the program, no later than March 21, 2026. Installment plans are available:
 - 1st Payment - March 21, 2026
 - 2nd Payment - April 11, 2026
- **Refund Policy**: Due to staff capacity, we are unable to offer refunds.
